1. Each exhibitor must have a separate number.
2. An exhibitor may only enter once in any class.
3. Exhibits must be made or grown by the exhibitor (except flowers, fruit or vegetables used in the Floral Art section (Classes 85-91)
4. All exhibits must be staged between 8am and 10-30 am on the day of the Show.
5. No exhibits may be removed before 4.00pm
6. Entries in Garden, Flower, Largest Produce , Pot Plant and Adult Art classes are restricted to Llanferres Parish residents and Club Members. Other sections are Open.
7. All exhibits may be entered free of charge.
8. Completed entry forms MUST be received by 6pm on the Wednesday before the Show.
9. The Judges decision will be final.
10. The Committee reserve the right to refuse an entry.
11. The articles exhibited at the Show shall remain at the risk of the exhibitor. The Committee shall use their best endeavour to protect the same, but in no way be responsible for any loss or injury.
- 12 All trophies must be returned in good condition to Mr David Jones or Mrs Glenys Roberts by August 1st.
13. Exhibitors in ALL classes MUST be amateurs.
- 14 Points are awarded:-1st ,4pts 2nd ,3pts 3rd ,2pts
