# Show Rules

1. Each exhibitor must have a separate number.
2. An exhibitor may only enter once in any class.
3. Exhibits must be made or grown by the exhibitor (except flowers, fruit or vegetables used in the Floral Art section (classes 85 - 93)
4. All exhibits must be staged between 8.00 a.m. and 10.30 a.m. on the day of the show.
5. No exhibits may be removed before 4.00 p.m.
6. Entries in Garden, Flower, Largest Produce and Pot Plant classes are restricted to Llanferres Parish residents or Garden Club members. All other sections are Open.
7. All exhibits may be entered free of charge.
8. Entries can be made by completing and returning an entry form or by emailing [llanferres.show@outlook.com](mailto:llanferres.show@outlook.com) with the exhibitor's name and address, classes to be entered and, if 16 or under, age on 1 September 2015.
9. All entries MUST be received by 6.00 p.m. on the Wednesday before the Show.
10. The Judges' decision will be final.
11. The Committee reserve the right to refuse an entry.
12. The articles exhibited at the Show shall remain at the risk of the exhibitor.  
The Committee shall use their best endeavour to protect the same, but in no way be responsible for any loss or injury.
13. All trophies must be returned in good, clean condition to Hugo and Ivy Watts or Josh and Chris Griffiths by 1 August.
14. Exhibitors in ALL classes MUST be amateurs.
15. Points are awarded as follows: 1st 4 points; 2nd 3 points; 3rd 2 points.
